The goal of our Humane Education Program at GTHS is to teach students about the special relationship humans have with companion animals, recognizing that we share many of the same physical and emotional needs.






Guardian Angel Donors SAVED MICKEY'S LIFE and gave her HOPE.



We would not be able to run this food bank without the incredible support for each and every business and community members that makes in-kind food donations to our shelter.




